

WEST MICHIGAN YOUTH SAILING ASSOCIATION EMERGENCY ACTION CARD

SPRING LAKE

If possible, emergency assistance should be provided by trained Coaches.

The nearest Coach shall be the first to respond, regardless of sailor's club affiliation.

Spectators should only assist if trained Coaches are not nearby and the situation is extremely urgent.

STEP	ACTION	CONTACT	CONTACT METHOD
1	Assess the situation. A. Notify the Race Committee. B. Find a nearby coach. If no coach is available, render assistance and secure the area. Instruct other sailors to avoid the area and stabilize the sailor until help arrives.	RC and nearby coach	VHF ____ or VHF ____
2	If emergency medical attention is required, call for help. A. To request ambulance or EMT Coach or Race Committee calls 911. Make sure to give them clear directions as to where they should park to be close to the dock where the injured sailor will arrive. <i>Grand Haven Coast Guard also monitors 911 broadcasts.</i> B. For on-the-water rescue Coach or Race Committee contacts the US Coast Guard. <i>Ottawa County Sheriff Marine Patrol is coordinated through 911, Coast Guard may also coordinate Sheriff Patrol assistance.</i>	911 Emergency Center US Coast Guard	Call 911 VHF channel 16

3	Communicate with on-shore Person. Coach or Race Committee contacts WMYSA on-shore person. If WMYSA on-shore person does not answer, Coach or Race Committee contacts Spring Lake Yacht Club clubhouse.	_____ Spring Lake Yacht Club	phone_____ 616-847-8322
4	Prepare to receive injured sailor A. On-shore personnel clear a path for Emergency Vehicles to access the injured sailor. B. Coach transfers injured sailor to nearest on-shore location as shown on the map on the back of this card. C. Coach and on-shore personnel transfer injured sailor into the care of Emergency Responders.

6	All involved parties convene to complete an accident report.
